








#### South Bend, IN

### In Memoriam: Soror Isabel C. Taylor



*Isabel Connolly Taylor* was born Queen Isabel Connolly in Savage, Mississippi to Lena and Toney Connelly. Her parents instilled in her Godly principles and the virtues of womanhood. Her house became a classroom as she was taught by her grandfather, Mr. Jackson.

On April 12, 1931, she married Luke Taylor. Together they bore and raised ten amazing children, five boys and five girls. They emphasized the values of hard work and education. Therefore, it is no surprise that their children

became successful entrepreneurs, educators, and government officials throughout the cities of Chicago and Los Angeles.

Soror Taylor's joy of motherhood and love for Christ was followed closely by her passion for education. She followed in her family's footsteps by becoming an Educator. A high achiever, she took and passed the state of Mississippi teaching test and was assigned a position. She continued teaching until her retirement in 1959.

The author and poet was an advocate for education and social change. Similar to the organization that she joined 40+ years ago, she has been a champion for change. She stood in the trenches arm to arm with current and past civil rights leaders; spent over 40 years educating children in classrooms from Holly Springs, Mississippi to Chicago, Illinois; published literary works; and continually provide service to Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated until her death in January 2014 at the age of 104.

*Whereas*, Soror Isabel C. Taylor was a finer woman and special gift to many, giving tirelessly to Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated and Zeta Tau Zeta Chapter of Chicago, Illinois; never tiring in her efforts to serve the sisterhood.

*Whereas,* in celebration of Isabel C. Taylor's 104<sup>th</sup> birthday in August 2013, the state of Illinois honored the life-long learner and Educator by naming a scholarship in her honor. *The Isabel C. Taylor Scholarship* was created to assist and support high school students preparing to matriculate in an institution of higher learning. The revolving scholarship (based on the host site of the leadership conference) will assist young adults throughout the state of Illinois.

*Be It Resolved*, that Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated and the state of Illinois share in sorrow in the passing of Soror Isabel C. Taylor, but more importantly, we recognize that this loss is Heaven's gain.

*May It Be Further Resolved*, that members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated and the state of Illinois will continue to walk in her footsteps and honor the legacy of love that she left, for we are truly blessed to have known Soror Isabel C. Taylor.

## Tribute to a True Blue Hoosier

On our 94<sup>th</sup> Founders' Day, Triumphant Soror/ Congresswoman Julia

M. Indiana's Carson, first African American and first woman from Indianapolis elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, was memorialized with a bronze bust at the Indiana Statehouse in Indianapolis. The unveiling of the historic bust created by Jon Hair occurred during the 23rd Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Indiana Holiday Celebration.

Throughout her life, Soror Julia M. Carson worked to overcome barriers imposed on her and on others by racism and sexism. A graduate of Crispus Attucks High School, Carson was elected to the Indiana House of Representatives in November 1972 and served two terms. In 1976, she was elected to the Indiana Senate ---one of the first two African American women in that house — where she served for the next fourteen years. That same year, past Great Lakes Regional Director, the late Soror Effie L. Burford. recommended her to become an Honorary Member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

The bronze bust has a permanent home on the third floor of the Indiana Statehouse.









